**Library Board Bylaw** – Library Board Bylaw 19.22 updates the previous bylaw changing the budget deadlines to better align with Yellowhead County's schedule discussions as well as providing the Board and the County the opportunity to work jointly when determining library locations and leases.

**Federal Boundary Changes** – Council will send a letter expressing their concern over a proposed federal electoral boundary change which could place Yellowhead County into two federal electoral boundaries. The letter will request that the municipality of Yellowhead County stay within one federal riding

No service at this time; a luncheon will be announced at a later date and will be in Vernon B.C.



# **Raising awareness of bullying**

awareness campaign "Pink Shirt Day".

The theme this year is "Be Kind". It is a simple but powerful message encouraging us to look beyond our differences and celebrate the things that make us unique.

This theme also encourages Albertans to be inclusive, welcoming and supportive with colleagues, clients, friends and family. Building healthy relationships is one of the best ways to prevent bullying and create safe environments.

As parents, we worry about our children being bullied and schools can be a place where bullying is encountered most frequently.

Bullying is a form of aggression where there is a power imbalance; the person doing the bullying has power over the person being victimized. It is a conscious, wilful, deliberate, hostile, and repeated behaviour by one or more people which is intended to harm others. It can take on many forms including physical, verbal, emotional, cyber, and peer exclusion. Bullying can result in serious emotional problems, including anxiety, low self-esteem, depression, or worse.

One in five children are affected by bullying. Even with the added awareness in recent years, every

Pink Shirt Day is a reminder to parents, teachers, and students of just how critical it is to ensure that our children are safe inside and outside of school.

The day offers an important reminder and helps to keep public attention focused on a problem that is so damaging and destructive within our schools and society.

However, reminders alone will not be enough to bring an end to this age old problem. Bullying is a complex multi-level problem, and in order to address these negative behaviours, solutions also need to be on multiple levels.

Parents play a key role in teaching children how to be inclusive. empathetic, and how to deal with feelings without becoming aggressive. With the support of important programs like Family and Community Support Services, and teaching empathy at the classroom level, communities that focus on helping to promote inclusion, respect, and empathy have been the most successful at reducing bullying behaviours.

Can we ever get rid of bullying completely? Probably not. This is why reducing bullying must be an ongoing effort with the whole community working together, so every child feels valued, equal, and safe.

# Forensics Crime Sleuths at Grand Trunk High

(GYPSD) This year at Grand Trunk High School students in Evansburg have the opportunity to enroll in the Forensic Studies Elective Program.

In the first semester, high school students from grades ten to twelve are able to take Forensic Studies 25 for three credits. Students can then take Forensic Studies 35 in the second semester to earn three thirty-level credits towards their high school diploma. Junior high students will have the opportunity to experience the field of forensic science through a CTF course in the second semester.

In the Forensic Science elective, students learned a variety of different skills and acquired a deep base of knowledge about evidence collection and analysis, as well as the ethical complexities that confront experts using forensics evidence to



administer justice.

Using hands-on activities, lab demonstrations, and experiential learning, students encountered the roles and responsibilities associated with forensics.


Students also explore career possibilities in the field of forensic science. As part of their career exploration, students were provided with a presentation from Ken Bruns, a retired Forensic Investigator and Detective from the Edmonton Police Service. He covered several different topics, including careers in forensics, the science used in investigations, and the types of equipment forensics investigators use. The presentation also included several demonstrations of actual techniques and materials used by forensic investigators.

Students were able to see how fingerprint powder is used to lift prints off of various surfaces, and how to administer different chemical tests at crime scenes.


Then on January 29, a few members and leaders went to an advanced equine first aid course. Everyone learned a lot and had lots of
