PCHS graduation fundraiser features trivia and hypnotist

Parkland Composite High School held something different this year to help raise funds for their upcoming graduation celebration—a Trivia/Hypnotist Fundraiser night.

The event was held at the Edson Friendship Centre on April 26.

19 teams answered questions on a variety of topics ranging from movies and sports to 'are you smarter than a fifth grader'. Team 'Awesome' won first place.

After the trivia challenge, there was more fun and laughs with Gavin Hooper hitting the stage with his professional comedy/hypnotist act. Gavin flew in from Kelowna to Edmonton then drove to Edson just in time to start his show. He had volunteers join him on stage where he used hypnosis to create a humorous and entertaining experience for the audience.

It was a fantastic evening of great food and entertainment, and a great way to help raise money for graduation.

Kim Brodersen, president for the Parkland Grad-Parent Celebration Committee, said, "This year is a significant event as it's the largest grad class in history for the school, with 160 kids graduating this year. With a bigger class comes a bigger number to attend the banquet. We are having 816 individuals attend which is the maximum capacity we are allowed."

The event will be held at the Edson Leisure Centre, which is currently under construction. "Between decorating costs, food, insurance, along with all the other expenses that go along with a graduation, it can become very costly. I believe we have raised around \$50,000 from fundraising which includes ticket sales. We try to keep the cost as low as we can by doing these types of events to help raise money," said Brodersen.

The meal was cooked and served by volunteers and put together by Gil Belcourt.
Dinner was roast turkey, baked ham, mashed potatoes, stuffing, mixed veggies, macaroni salad, Caesar salad, bannock, and an assortment of baked desserts.

"Tonight we had 135 people plus 15 volunteers. The volunteers were here all day long cooking and doing the serving and clean up. Many volunteers don't even have any students graduating, they are just here to help and support the grad class —pretty amazing!" said Brodersen.

Powering up communities with ag society dollars

Alberta's government is helping the province's regional agricultural societies plan for tomorrow with new and continued funding.

Agricultural societies play a crucial role in the province's rural communities. They bring people together, organize and run events and improve the overall quality of life for residents in their communities.

Alberta has more agriculture societies than any other province with 292 organizations. Alberta's government is helping regional agricultural societies weather increasing costs and plan ahead with a one-time cash injection of more than \$7.4 million.

"It's hard to overstate the impact regional agricultural societies have on rural Alberta. From event organizing to infrastructure upkeep, they energize folks and bring communities together. This funding will ensure our regional agriculture societies are able to keep up their good work and continue to be pillars of their communities." - RJ Sigurdson, Minister of Agriculture and Irrigation

New funding includes \$4.03 million in onetime supports distributed among the seven regional ag societies to help them manage cost pressures and allow them to plan for the future, including achieving more sustainable operational models. It also includes a one-time investment of \$2.87 million to support business transformation projects and funding set aside for a third-party consultant to help with those efforts.

This is on top of the continued annual total funding of \$2.8 million for regional agricultural societies through the Agricultural Societies Grant Program.

In 2024, Alberta's government hired Deloitte to conduct a sustainability assessment of the societies and provide recommendations to address their financial struggles. Those recommendations helped inform this funding and the next steps.

· Alberta's seven regional agricultural societies are in Camrose, Grande Prairie, Lethbridge, Lloydminster, Olds, Medicine Hat and Red Deer.

· Regional is a long-standing historic designation for these seven agricultural societies.

• Each regional agricultural society currently receives total annual funding of \$398,853, including a base grant of \$298,853 and an operating grant of \$100,000 to support agricultural event days.

Weed Inspections to begin in Yellowhead County

Weed inspections will take place throughout the summer months of 2025 in Yellowhead County. Please be advised that the Weed Inspectors based in the Wildwood County office will be out in full force, documenting various invasive plants on both county and private lands. You may see a white County vehicle near your property and an inspector in a high visibility vest performing weed inspections so please be considerate of their safety.

Please keep in mind that The Weed Control Act grants an Inspector right of entry onto private land during reasonable hours (The Weed Control Act, Part 3, and Section 12). The Agricultural Services Department of Yellowhead County believes that a courtesy should be extended to landowners to inform them of what is taking place on their property. The County continues to promote a "Door Knocking" Program to make contact with landowners before a weed inspection takes place.

We inform the property owners of the approximate date and time of when an inspection

will take place, and the Weed Inspectors can then address any questions or concerns the landowner may have at that time. If landowners are not home during the time of the "Door Knocking" Program, they will find a placard on their door or gate letting them know that an inspector was there and that they can call the inspector for more information before the actual inspection takes place. The results of the inspection(s) and weed information sheets will be mailed out to the landowners within a couple weeks of the completed inspection(s).
